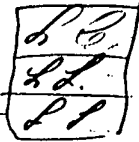

This Deed of conveyance made and entered into this tenth day of May, in the year of our Lord, One thousand eight hundred, and twenty, five between Henry W. Senior, Worshipful Master, Sherard L. Campbell, Senior Warden, and William A. C. Benson, Junior Warden, Trustees of Santa Rosa Lodge No. 16, of Free and Accepted Masons, located in the town of Milton Santa Rosa County, & State of Florida, of the first part, and Florida Cobb Johnson, wife of Judge David B. Johnson of the said town, County, & State, of the second part, witnesseth that the said party of the first part, Trustees as aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred Dollars, of good and lawful money of the United States of America to them in hand paid, by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and confessed here bargained granted, sold, conveyed, conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents do bargain, grant, sell, convey, convey and confirm unto the said party of the second part, her heirs and assigns forever the following described certain piece of Land, situate lying and being in the County of Santa Rosa and State of Florida, and within the Corporation of the town of Milton, known, and being quartered on a plot, surveyed and laid off, by John M.
