Union all men by these presents, that whereas the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida in a decree wherein William L. Gregor, and individually and as a member of the firm of Gregor, Balchewar and Parley, bankrupt on the 2nd day of December, A.D. 1871. caused a decree ordering the sale of the lands of the late firm of Gregor, Balchewar & Parley situated in the Counties of Santa Rosa and Walton in the State of Florida.
