Homestead Certificate No 6836 } To all to whom these presents
Application 18300 } shall come - greeting:

Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States of a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Gainesville - Florida, whereby it appears that pursuant to the act of Congress approved 20th May 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers of the Public Domain" and the act supplemental thereto, the claim of Charles E Deems has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the North-West quarter of section fourteen, in Township One North of Range twenty - nine West of Tallahassee Meridian in Florida, containing one hundred and sixty acres and thirteen hundredths of an acre according to the official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General.

Now know ye, that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Charles E Deems the tract of Land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Charles E Deems and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand at the City of Washington, the third day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty - nine, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and thirteenth.
