To all whom these presents shall
Come, greeting

Whereas there has been deposited in the
General Land Office of the United States a certificate
of the Register of the Land Office at Gainesville
Florida whereby it appears that pursuant to
the Act of Congress approved May 20 1862 "To
secure Homesteads to actual Settlers on the public
Domain" and the acts supplemental thereto, the
claim of John McSillan has been established
and duly consummated, in conformity to law
for the North East quarter of Section Eleven in
Township five North of Range Twenty seven
West of Tallahassee meridian in Florida
containing one hundred and sixty acres
and forty nine hundredths of an acre,
according to the official plat of the survey
of the said land, returned by to the General Land
Office by the Surveyor General,

Now know ye that there is therefore granted
by the United States unto the said John McSillan
the tract of land above described,
To have and to hold the said tract of land
with the appurtenances thereof unto the said
John McSillan and to his heirs and assigns forever
In testimony whereof I Benjamin Harrison
President of the United States of America have
caused these letters to be made patent, and the
Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed
Given under my hand at the City of Washington
the twentieth day of June in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one
and of the Independence of the United States the
one hundred and fiftieth
