To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting
Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land
Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the
Land Office at Gainesville Florida, whereby it appears
that pursuant to the act of Congress approved 20th
May 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual Settlers on
the Public Domain" and the acts Supplemental
thereto, the claim of Henry Pray has been established
and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for
the West half of the South East quarter and the East
half of the South West quarter of Section fourteen
in Township two North of Range twenty nine West
of Tallahassee meridian in Florida. Containing
one hundred and sixty acres and six hundredths of an
acre according to the official plat of the survey of the said land
returned to the general land office by the Surveyor General.
Now know ye that there is therefore granted by the
United States unto the said Henry Pray that tract of
Land above described; To have and to hold the said tract
of Land with the appurtenances thereto unto the said
Henry Pray and to his heirs and assigns forever.

of the United States of America have caused these letters
to be made Patent and the seal of the General Land
