Dear Judge Ballow:

I acknowledge receipt of your letter of January 28, requesting the military service record of Shade Controll as a Confederate Soldier.

The records show that Shade Cantrell of Athens, Henderson County. Texas filed application for Confederate Pension in August 1909 and the same was approved under file number 18703. The records also show that Shade Cantrell was a private in Company D. 13th Texas Cavalry, Confederate States Army. He enlisted February 22, 1862. Date of discharge is not shown, but states he served three and one-half years.

If you desire to make application for a headstone for the grave of Ir. Cantrell, then you should write the Quartermaster General, War Department, Washington, D. C. requesting blanks for making application for same.
